In 1873 Mother's **PEACE DAY** celebrations took place in at least five countries for **THIRTY SIX** years. The five countries were: **UNITED STATES, ENGLAND, SWITZERLAND, ITALY** and **TURKEY**. In 1907 **ANA JARVIS** from **PHILADELPHIA** began a campaign to start a national Mother's Day. She had persuaded her mother's church in **GRAFTON, WEST VIRGINIA** to celebrate it on the 2<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of her own mother's **DEATH**. Her occupation was a **SCHOOL TEACHER**. Her favourite flower which became a symbol for the celebration was the **WHITE CARNATION**. By 1911 Mother's Day was celebrated in almost every **STATE**. The Mother's Day **INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION** (2 words) was incorporated for the purpose of promoting the day and its observance. In 1914, **WOODROW WILSON** officially declared it as a national holiday to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in May. The founder later began to be so outraged by the way Mother's Day was becoming so **COMMERCIALIZED** that she even was **ARRESTED** for demonstrating against certain Mother's Day conventions. Eventually she lost everything and everyone around her and died in a **SANATORIUM** in 1948. She told a reporter she was **SORRY** she ever started Mother's Day.
